1. ***ፋሲካ** FASIKA or Passover – March 29 (Nisan 14)
2. **ቂጣ በዓል** QI'TA BE'AL or Feast of the Unleavened Bread – March 30 to April 5th
3. **በኩራት በዓል** BEKURAT NEDO or Firstfruits = Memorial of CHRIST'S RESURRECTION DAY/ Yom Habikkurim – April 11th (**አሁኑ** 1st Day - the first “Sunday” *after end of the 7 days of the Qi'ta be'Al*)
4. **መክር በዓል** MEKER BE'AL or HARVEST FESTIVAL = 50 Days/7 Weeks after Bekurat Nedo or “Pentecost”/ Shabuwa – 30th May
5. ****መገቻ ቀን** MEBACHA Q'EN/ **መለከት ድምፅ መታሰቢያ** Meleket D'mts Metasebiya – the Festival of TRUMPETS or ROSH HASANA, Hebrew New Year – 9th September
6. **ሰርየት ቀን** SERYET Q'EN, the Day of ATONEMENT/ **አስተሰርዮ** Astesriyo or YOM KIPPUR – 18th September
7. *****ዳስ በዓል** DASS BE'AL/ **ሱኩት** Sukkot INGATHERING – from the 22nd September (Autumn traditionally begins) to the 29th Day

*THREE ANNUAL FESTIVALS “በዓመት ሦስት ጊዜ በዓል ታደርግልኛለህ።” – ኦሪት ዘጸአት **Exodus 23:14** – See, The Autobiography of Emperor HAILE SELASSIE I, pg 41 where His Imperial Majesty refers to the three annual festivals, i.e. for Mäsqäl (pronounced *mes-qel*), Christmas, and Easter. Mäsqäl is the feast of the Cross.

** **Ethiopian NEW YEAR September 11th 2010** = Sabbath/SENBET or High Holy Day this year (2010)

*** **The 29th Day of September** = **Hosanna Rabba (Rebi)** - Save us Oh Great One
